I've carried wounds that don't show on the outside and grief that no ribbon or commendation can balance. Those years taught me something I still hold close: healing is real, and it's worth every bit of effort we give it.

After the Corps, I found new missions in supply chain and operations leadership. I've been fortunate to work with outstanding teams at Sierra Space and GE Aerospace, helping deliver mission-critical hardware for programs that reach for the stars. The discipline and focus I learned in uniform translated into building stronger systems, negotiating better outcomes, and keeping complex projects on track—often saving millions along the way. Closer to home, I also founded a real estate company whose primary purpose is to help Veterans and their families turn military benefits into stable homes and generational wealth.

All of that success taught me a simple truth: a stable career and a good home can steady a life, but only true emotional healing can bring back the light.
